Door Creek Orchard Photographer Policy

Door Creek Orchard is a popular location for photography. Families enjoying a day on our farm during REGULAR business hours, September – November, are welcome to take as many photos as they would like.

Professional photographers and their clients are permitted on our farm as well. To provide everyone with a positive, safe experience, these are our guidelines for professional photographers:

- 1. Photographers are welcome to take photos during NORMAL BUSINESS HOURS. Because of insurance considerations, absolutely no photos are allowed while we are closed.
- 2. Photography is allowed only in areas of the orchard or farm that are open to the public. You must check in with our manager on duty to sign-in and to find out what areas you may enter. You must be finished by our closing time.
- 3. All professional photographers must have written consent from the owners, and must carry said written consent in the form of an ID tag on his/her person while on the farm property. A parking tag is also required. Tags are supplied at sign-in. A \$10 deposit is required for the two tags, which will be refunded when tags are returned at the end of the session.

4. Location fees: •Tues-Fri - \$25 per hour session

•Sat & Sun - \$75 per hour session during PYO

\$50 per hour session during non-PYO October

\$25 per hour session during November

Note: locations fees are assessed per session, not per photographer. Sessions are scheduled by the hour; running over the time limit will initiate a second session fee. Fees are paid in advance at sign-in.

- 5. Even if you have advance permission via email or phone, you must check in with the manager on duty to sign-in, pick-up a photographer ID and parking ID, and to pay for your session.
- 6. Door Creek does not supply props, furniture, signs, etc.; photographers must bring their own.
- 7. All orchard policies must be followed. You must remain in designated open areas and pay for any fruit you pick. Please do not climb trees, waste fruit, litter, or act in any unsafe manner.
- 8. Photography for magazines, catalogs, publications, advertising, mass media or any other unlisted category, including videography, must contact the Orchard for fee information and scheduling.
